The scenario that the State is leaning towards is Scenario 3: aggregate social services governance at zone levels. It was discussed that it makes sense that the 8 counties of Dunn, Stark, Hettinger, Adams, Bowman, Slope, Billings and Golden Valley would be a zone/region.

Darin Maus, Dan Buccholz, and Jamie Gray met with the Board to discuss the ambulance mill levy. Maus asked the Board to consider raising the mill to the 10 mill max in the future to help cover State mandates to keep the ambulance in compliance with the regulations and to help pay those that are on call to keep the volunteer numbers up.

Road Foreman Pete Wirtzfeld and Andrew Krebs with KLJ met with the Board. Krebs informed the Board that the Beaver Creek Bridge is complete and the final pay estimate has been submitted to the DOT for final payment.

Discussion was held on gravel crushing at Hoot Owl on Byron Richards. Wirtzfeld contacted the surrounding Townships to inform them of the available gravel.

**GOLDEN VALLEY CO. TREASURER**

- An invoice from the Roosevelt Custer Regional Council for an annual contribution for 2019 in the amount of \$5,700 was presented to the Board. It was agreed to discuss this at the March Meeting when a representative will be present.

- The Board has set the Annual Park Board meeting at the March 5<sup>th</sup> regular meeting at 11 a.m. in the County Commissioner's room.
- Information Technology support for the County was discussed. County Auditor Tamra Sperry will gather quotes for the support and present them to the Board at the next regular meeting on March 5, 2019.
- Discussion was held on the Building Committee. It was agreed Commissioner Steffen will replace past Commissioner Donald Maus on the Committee.
- States Attorney Christina Wenko gave the Board an update on cases she is working on for the County.

Tax Director Henry Gerving met with Board and discussed the ag land value which has been set at \$307.39 for 2019. Gerving then request that the Board approve of 3 abatements from Meilon Hildebrant as Vanguard priced his parcel as the incorrect parcel. Commissioner Steffen made a motion to approve an abatement for the years of 2016, 2017 and 2018 for the parcel number 9-0-02237100 located at 3931 Highway 16, Beach, ND 58621 and Commissioner Schmitz seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the request from Slope County to lease the bottom space of our antenna on the Sentinel Butte Hill Tower. Commissioner Schmitz made a motion to allow Slope County to lease the space and States Attorney Christina Wenko will create the lease and Gerving will present it to Slope County and Commissioner Schmeling seconded. Motion carried.

Kim Gaugler joined the meeting.

10 am was the advertised time to have a public hearing with a second reading and final passage on Ordinance 2019-1 amending the zoning code. Commissioner Steffen made a motion to accept and adopt the ordinance and Commissioner Schmeling seconded. Motion carried. Commissioner Steffen made a motion to vacate the motion so the Board can open up the public hearing and Commissioner Schmitz seconded. Motion carried. Chairman Steffen opened the public hearing. After discussion it was agreed to make some edits to clarify the wording and the edits will be made to the presented ordinance. A discussion was had to clarify that the Commission wanted all buildings including agricultural buildings to require a building permit; however, the permit fee would be waived for agricultural buildings. Commissioner Steffen made a motion to close the public hearing and Commissioner Schmitz seconded. Motion carried. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Golden Valley County, North Dakota, as follows:

Section 1: An amendment to the Zoning Code is hereby approved as follows

#### 6.5 Permits, Procedures, and Fees

Permits are required for all Buildings including agricultural buildings and conditionally permitted uses in all districts in accordance with this ordinance and said permits shall be received by the applicant before physical action on the use may be taken and must be complied with. A fee is required for all Buildings, except agricultural buildings in an agricultural district, which will be determined by the zoning director at the time of application for the permit. Said fee shall be paid to the County Auditor. All fee payments shall be deposited in the county general fund.

##### 6.5.1 Building Permits

A building permit is required prior to the construction or moving in of any building or structure and whenever the outside dimensions of an existing building are altered. The conditions of the permit must be adhered to. To receive a building permit, an application which shall include the following shall be submitted to the zoning director.

- 1) Description of the nature or function of the building, structure or addition.
- 2) Description of the size, principle construction materials used and cost of the building, structure or addition.
- 3) A legal description of the property and a plat map of a reasonable scale which shows the size of building or structure, its position on the lot and surrounding yard dimensions.
- 4) Must demonstrate compliance with district requirements and permitted uses.
- 5) A building permit shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issuance. The term of the permit may be extended for good cause shown.
- 6) The fee schedule for building permits shall be determined by the County Commission.

Section 2: Repeal of Ordinances in Conflict. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3: Severability. In the event any section of this Ordinance is held invalid by court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity shall extend only to the section affected, and other sections of this Chapter shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4: Effective Date: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after final passage.

Commissioner Schmitz made a motion to sign the memorandum of understanding between Golden Valley/Billings & Dunn Counties for providing social services and Commissioner Schmeling seconded. Motion carried. Commissioner Schmeling made a motion to allow Social Services to hire a Direct Care Associate position vacancy and Commissioner Steffen seconded. Motion carried.

Jack Cook, Bert Cook and Ben Baker with the Prairie West Development Council met with the Board to discuss the importance of having an economic development organization in Golden Valley County. They request that the Board consider giving the organization some funding to continue on or they face the possibility of closing. Discussion was also held on considering putting mills back on the tax roll for the future of the organization. The Board took no action at this time but will look into the County's financial status for possible funding.

Road Foreman Pete Wirtzfeld along with Andrew Krebs with KLJ and Jeremy Wood met with the Board. Krebs gave the Board an update on the status of the Mosher Bridge and Chairman Steffen signed the memorandum of agreement. Wood discussed with the Board the gravel he measured of Byron Richard's at the Hoot Owl pit. Wirtzfeld updated the Board on what the Road Crew have been working on.

1 PM was the advertised time for Annual/County Township Meeting. Commissioners Paul Schmitz, Robert Schmeling and Harley Steffen along with Weed Control Officer Mark Golberg, Road Foreman Pete Wirtzfeld and States Attorney Christina Wenko were present.

Vice Chairman Schmitz welcomed the group and thanked them for coming to the Annual County/Township Meeting. 17 Township officers from 8 of the 10 Townships were present for the meeting.

Tax Director Henry Gerving joined the meeting.

Road Foreman Pete Wirtzfeld presented the group with a handout with information on County custom rates and culvert policy, projects that were completed in 2018 and projects for 2019, overweight permitting, energy impact grants, mowing and crushing.

Tax Director, Henry Gerving discussed with the group about soil surveys and presented to the Townships his schedule for the Equalization Meetings in April.

Weed Control Officer Mark Golberg introduced himself. Discussion was held on the upcoming spray season. Discussion was also held on LAP funding and availability. Golberg informed the group that he is planning on putting a newsletter together in the next month or so with different information including rates and contact information.

There was a brief question and answer session.

Commissioner Schmeling made a motion to adjourn and Commissioner Schmitz seconded. Motion carried. Chairman Steffen declared the Annual Township/County meeting adjourned at 2:00 P.M.

With no other business left for the regular meeting Commissioner Schmeling made a motion to adjourn and Commissioner Steffen seconded. Motion carried. Chairman Steffen declared the meeting adjourned at 2:03 P.M.
